New Director of the Heartland Center

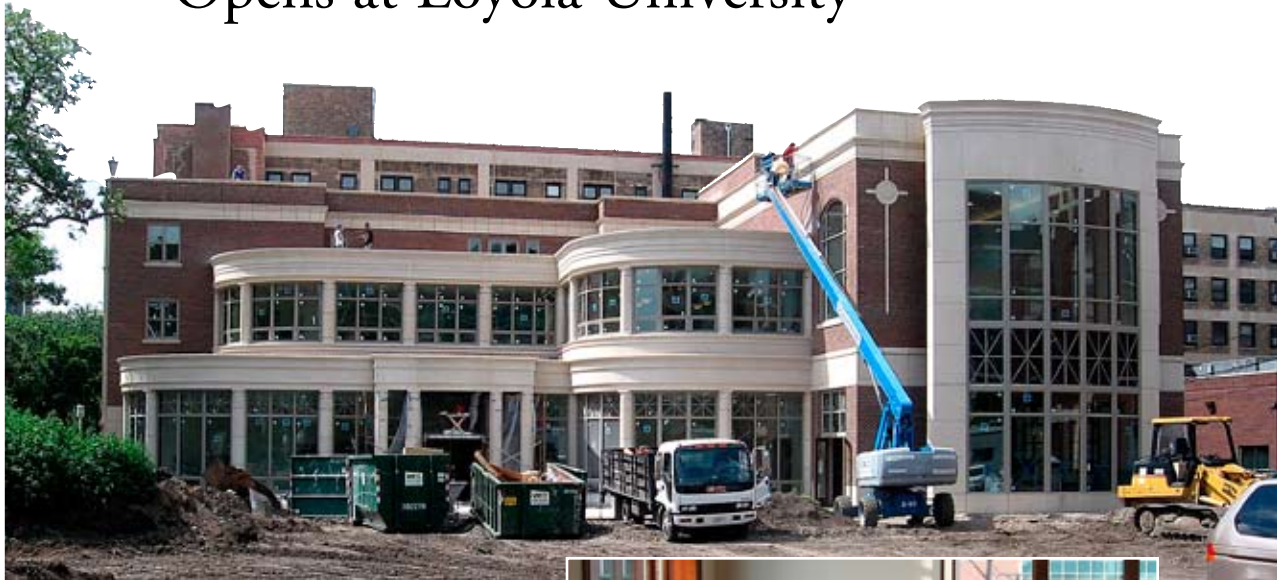
Fr. James M. Dixon, SJ, was appointed to be director of Heartland Center in Hammond, IN. Jim

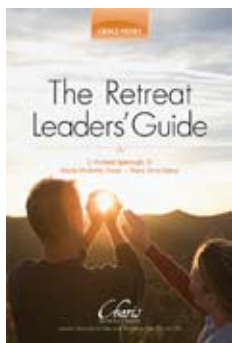




Charis MINISTRIES

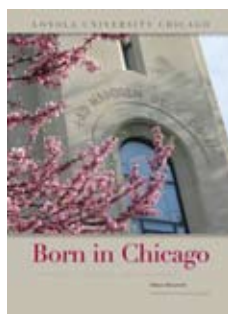
An introductory retreat that focuses on the young adult search for meaning in life, this book provides leaders with complete materials for planning, promoting, and implementing the Seekers' retreat.

Trustees and presidents representing the six high schools of the Chicago Province gathered at Loyola University on October 26, 2008, to discuss Jesuit secondary education. Fr. Provincial Edward Schmidt convened the group for a day of prayer and conversation. Presenters included Frs. Ray Guiao, SJ, Pat McGrath, SJ, and Brad Schaeffer, SJ.

Conversation topics included Jesuit commitment to secondary education, Jesuit sponsorship and trusteeship, enhanced formation of board members in the Jesuit tradition, insights into Jesuit formation, and the future of Jesuits working in high schools.

Pat McGrath, SJ, provincial assistant for secondary education, said, "The mission and identity of Jesuit schools is held in trust by the school's governing board. As a result, it is utterly essential that board members not only understand the Jesuit mission and Ignatian vision but that they also have a lived experience of it."

The meeting at Loyola University was another in a series that attempts to enrich the conversation that goes on between the schools and the Society of Jesus and to deepen our shared experience of Ignatius' vision. Specifically, attendees heard from Frs. Schaeffer and Schmidt about the ongoing commitment of the Society to secondary education. Each spoke of high schools as one of the most significant and effective works of the Society. Fr. McGrath offered some perspective on canon and civil law issues involved in school sponsorship, and Fr. Guiao spoke with the trustees about Jesuit formation. The conversation that took place among the trustees was lively and engaged.
