ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THE KIBERA SLUM OF

FOR THE PAST SIX YEARS, St. Al's has served HIV/AIDS affected young people in the Kibera slum of Nairobi. Every student at St. Al's has lost one or both of his or her parents to AIDS. Despite the amazing accomplishments at St. Al's, conditions are not ideal. The current school building has capacity to serve 280 students and is dark, small, stuffy and not very conducive to learning.

Thankfully, a new facility is now under construction! This new school building will greatly enhance the students' learning experience and allow student enrollment to increase to 420. The construction of the school will be completed in April 2010 with 12 classrooms, three science laboratories, a chapel, two computer centers, several offices, and a dining hall.
