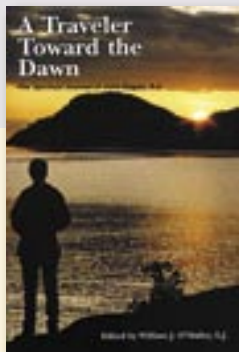


Heroic Leadership Author Visits Province
